

Circles, Circles Everywhere

I was really excited when Alamo Squadron decided to feature a tool expo at a meeting several months ago. Members were encouraged to bring a favorite tool to present to the group. The exercise replaced the monthly technique class which I always look forward to—but the opportunity to learn from our typical 30-40 member meeting a hefty dose of favorite tools was something that probably only comes every few years, so I was really looking forward to this one.

I brought two tools to the meeting: The UMM-USA SCR-01 Scriber Tool and a super lightweight foam board I found at Hobby Lobby for a few bucks to assist with landing gear alignment. These tools have become indispensable to me during aircraft builds and so I enjoyed sharing them with the club.

There was another tool I had just acquired that I didn't have time to trial prior to the tool expo. I have since had an opportunity to trial the tool and am so impressed with its performance that I wanted to share it here. The tool should prove useful across the many genres of our hobby, from aircraft to armor, from auto to Gundam, to sci-fi and maybe even to ships?

The tool is a circle cutter. This particular one is sold by Meng but looks to be the same manufactured by Dispiae. I purchased it after much "hemming and hawing" over the price, but because I have learned that a good tool is "worth its weight in gold", I took the plunge and bought it after saving up my pennies.


The tool requires assembly which took some thought and time because the assembly diagram is a bit un-magnified and lacking words and maybe because I am not the sharpest tool in the shed. The tool itself is incredibly well machined and made of "aircraft grade aluminum". It comes with three cutting blades of slightly differing shape- for depth of cut I presume. Once loaded, the blade is held in place by a tiny magnet. The radius of the desired cut is determined and set on the 1 to 25mm scale. Masking tape is laid down onto the cutting mat, the cutter is placed on top, and the blade is lowered until it barely touches the tape. Ensuring that the blade is barely touching the tape is how you get a terrific, clean cut. The circle cutter is precise and cuts circles in masking tape from diameters 1 to 50mm, in increments ad infinitum. In other words, if you want to cut a circular mask in any diameter from 1mm to 50mm, you can do it with this tool. In any diameter. Did I mention in any diameter?

For a guy like me that builds aircraft kits this is a pretty big deal for masking wheels or dials or the corners of canopy windows etc. If I was building an armor kit or auto or motorcycle kit it might even be a bigger deal for wheels, dials, barrels, hatches. Masking accuracy and speed. No more buying mask sets—I can make my own.

There is a degree of flexibility in its application too: You can create inner or outer masks. You can mask partial curves. And by cutting thin strips you can mask asymmetrical curves easier than with a straight cut of tape. For the purpose of this article I have provided some examples of its use during my work on a 1/32 Wingnut Wings cockpit floor from their Pfalz d.XII and also some pics from masks I cut for my son's Pegasus 1/48 Hawker Hurricane wheels.



The blade is lowered until it barely touches the tape.






Further masking to protect the wood floor. Paint applied.


Circle cutter masked details came out clean.






