March means it is time to think about club leadership roles. The election of the 2022-2023 club officers will take place in April. So, we will be making nominations in the upcoming March meeting. The club has three officer positions: **President, Vice President, and Treasurer**.

These three positions constitute the club's Executive Board (E-Board). The term of service is one year, beginning in April. Officers are limited to three years of consecutive service before they must step out for at least one year before resuming service.

Please consider taking on a leadership position in our club and who you would nominate for these positions. Per the club's constitution, the criteria to be a club officer is as follows:

The individual must be an active Adult or Life member of Alamo Squadron. The individual must display the ability and willingness to discharge the duties of the respective Executive Board position.

The individual must be willing to be a member of IPMS/USA during the term of service.

The individual must be an active model builder.

The individual has been a paid member of Alamo Squadron for one year, paid by the time the term of office begins. Each officer shall be an Adult or Life member of the club living within a 150-mile radius of the Alamo Mission.

# MODEL KIT ORGANIZATION BY JULIO A. CARO



Greetings from the styrene trenches, my fellow modelers! Today, I'm going to be discussing a topic that is not about model building per se, but I believe it's related to the hobby and perhaps may be interest to some of you. I have a stash of over a hundred plus model kits that I've been collecting over the past few years. Until just recently, I really never kept an accurate or formal inventory of what I had and often relied on memory to keep track of all of them. There were times I bought a kit only to later find out that I already had it! To make matters worse, I kept my stash of kits in various places throughout the house, something the wife didn't appreciate.

About six months ago, I finally

decided to get off my duff and organize my collection of "treasures". I had to find a way to keep all my kits in one place and also have a way to help me keep track of them. After some pondering, I decided my office would be the best place to house my stash. Unfortunately, I had no room in my office closet for the kits, so I ended up having to build something to keep them in. I decided a credenza-like piece would do nicely; it could store most of my kits and I could also use it as a display case to display some of my favorite builds. It took me about a month to build it and I must say it turned out pretty darn nice! Here are some pictures of it:








With the storage situation solved, I then focused on how I was going to catalog and keep track of my collection. I decided that for me, a database was the best and most practical way to go. I know a thing or two about computers, so I created a Microsoft Access database as my tool of choice. Since the data I'm entering isn't too complex and the number of records is relatively small, I opted to create a simple, single-table none-relatable database. It consists of 13 data fields and a look-up field used to display the kit's box art. Here is what the field structure looks like:

I decided to use the **KIT-Number** field as my key field since most kit manufactures usually assign a unique number to identify each of the kits they produce.



To be able to display the box art pictures, I had to first create them. I did this by taking digital photos of my kits' box art and/or by finding and downloading then from the web whenever possible. Next, I saved all the photos to a designated directory on my hard drive named "KIT-Photos" where the database could find the photos to display them. If you're a geek like me and would like to



I also created several function buttons to let me more easily navigate through each record and perform other functions. The following is a screen shot of one of the records in my database:



In closing, I had a blast working on this project. I also have a great sense of accomplishment in finally getting my model kit stash organized. 
