

Alamo Squadron Club 1st Place Winner, Model of the Month, March 2022

It is a really cool thing to have a U.S. Navy warship carrying your family name, even if it was not really named after you, but a distant Irish clan relative who was killed at Pearl Harbor. The USS Buckley was an innovative design for Destroyer Escort, closer to a destroyer configuration, able to endure pounding seas of the North Atlantic in the hunt for German Submarines. USS Buckley DE57 featured twenty-four knot hull speed, displacement of 1700 tons, Beam of 37 ft, Hull Length 306 ft, and turboelectric engines rated at 13,000 shaft horsepower. Solid armament with a triple torpedo tube, eight death charge projectors and twin rear racks, a 3-inch

gun forward, eight 20mm antiaircraft guns, and one dual 75cal aircraft gun. Commissioned April 1943 and "Struck" or De-Commissioned, June 1968, with 3 years in mothball, DE57 had 20 years' active naval service.

1950's Revell Ship Model

This ship was originally molded by Revell Corporation in the mid-fifties at the scale of 1:248 and is considered a "Rare" model hence premium priced--see photo of the original advertisement for \$150 that was included in the box. However, I paid \$30 to a vendor at the recent Model Fiesta show.

Battle History of USS Buckley

DE57 Naval Battle History includes an unusual engagement May 1945 in the North Atlantic when she rammed German submarine U-66 with exceedingly rare ship-to-ship, hand-to-hand combat and grenades credited for the eventual sinking of U-66. Later patrol in the North Atlantic in 1945 with the soon to-befamous Reuben James DE35, immortalized in song

immortalized in song, the team sank German submarine U-879 on 19th of April 1945. Afterwards, USS Buckley raced to the Pacific theater and participated in the particularly nasty battle for Okinawa, surviving multiple kamikaze attacks while on picket duty.


I originally built a Revell USS Buckley model 12 years ago for my grandson Argyle, residing on his desk for several years before I took it back for repairs. It is shown herewith in Grey standard naval issue.





Dazzle Camouflage Measure 32/20

In 1944 USS Buckley adopted "dazzle" camouflage; considered effective with its confusing lines and shapes — including a painted silhouette of a submarine on its Starboard side. Look for it. The dazzle scheme "Measure 32/20" was horribly tedious to mask and paint each color and shape as seen in the diagram below:




Measure 32/20 Camouflage with my notes----see Submarine outline Port side



Kit Assembly

Molded detail of the Revell Kit is excellent, and the parts fit is terrific for a 40-year-old model---even if the assembly instructions rely heavily on exploded views, and clearly, I needed a lesson in rigging for handrails and mast ratlines.

The USS Buckley DE37 elaborate camouflage is dramatic---and the detailed superstructure is visually compelling--warranting a future plexiglass display case to preserve the model. So here is a piece of history --- and a namesake warship that my family most probably never knew existed.
